Rain jackets – the logistical nightmare!



The club acknowledge that kitting out everyone with a rain jacket has been an almost impossible task. The costs involved have been prohibitive (circa £4,500) and finding an appropriate supplier difficult. However, since we pledged to give every member a rain jacket we are now finally nearing our goal. Over the next few months we aim to give out rain jackets to all those members who have never previously been issued with one. Thereafter, we will be giving players and their families the opportunity to buy Winnersh Rangers rain jackets twice a year and full details as well as prices will be issued nearer the time. A full size range will be available for children and adults alike and the jackets will of course have the name and logo of the club printed on them.

To summarise therefore:

- Fully paid up members of Winnersh Rangers who have never been issued with a rain jacket will be given one by the club within the next month or two.
- Rain jackets issued by Winnersh Rangers are part of the club's kit, along with shirts, shorts and socks. All kit issued to player's remains the ownership of Winnersh Rangers FC and needs to be returned if/when a player leaves.
- Players joining the club after 31st December 2005 will not receive a rain jacket as part of their kit. They will, however, be given the opportunity to buy one.
- Any member who has been issued with a rain jacket at some time whilst playing for the club will not be receiving another. They will of course have the opportunity to buy a new one.
- Jackets that have been lost, defaced or those that are simply now too small will be not replaced by the club. Members will have the opportunity to buy new ones.

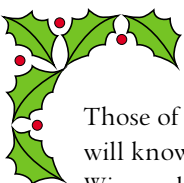

Good news on parking!

I am delighted to announce that by working with Winnersh Parish Council we have managed to secure two new parking areas for Winnersh Rangers.

- The first is the car park at Bearwood Primary School which will be open for us most weekends.
- The second is the **REAR CAR PARK** of the Walter Arms PH on Bearwood Road. *Please note that we must not use the front car park.* When walking to and from the Rec' parents and children should come out of the car park and up Sadlers End to Bearwood Road and **NOT** across the grass and through the small car park. Your co-operation is appreciated.

As I am sure most of you will now know, parking at the recreation ground continues to be difficult. We sincerely hope that these two new areas will be of great help to the club. There are other places where we can park of course and I would like to once again draw your attention to them:

- The car park itself. Please try and car share wherever possible and/or double park where you know other team members vehicles. *Please do not park cars in front of or around the bollards as this is a Health & Safety risk and would prevent access by one of the Emergency Service Vehicles, should they ever be needed.*
- New Road. Please park along one side of the road only and do not block the pavement. Access can easily be gained to the field.
- Bearwood Road. Again, please park along one side of the road only. Access to the ground can be gained by a bridge at the top of the field.
- The Masonic Lodge overflow car park *but only on specific occasions when permission is granted.*
- Please avoid parking on Mayfields **AT ANY TIME** due to particular sensitivities.

Please help us to maintain relations with the local residents by complying with these few requirements. Thank you!
